私は、Web4u を使ったドイツ語初級の講義を受けました。この形式で便利だと思った点が二つあります。一つ目は過去の講義で使われたパワーポイントがページに貼ってあり、見たい時にすぐに見て確認できることです。普通の講義だと参考資料は紙で配られることになるので散乱してしまいがちですが、web4u の場合は日付ごとに整理されたものがすでにあるので、習った順番ですぐに見直すことができました。二つ目は辞書システムです。このシステムを使えば、単語をドラッグするだけで辞書を引くことができるので、普通の辞書で単語を探す手間をすべて省くことができました。

From my opinion, Cybermedia Center of Osaka University is a place more than ordinary "University's computer rooms," where students just come to use computers, printing works and surfing internet. Instead, it is also the place which facilitates in improving their academic skills. In terms of language studies, there are many interesting programs installed for student uses. For foreign students like me, I can use these programs to learn more on Japanese vocabularies, as well as Kanji characters which are considered as very difficult parts for Japanese language studies. At the same time, students also have opportunities to improve other languages as well. For one example, there's a program which students can improve their English pronunciation in several accents. This is very useful for Japanese students, as well as for other students whose mother tongue is not English.

Apart from the language study, Cybermedia Center also facilitates studies in other subjects. Lecturers can upload various forms of teaching materials such as audio or video files on the university's web site. That can bring about the more creative methods in teaching for the students, making them understand the lecture even more.

At the same time, the lecturers can also upload video clips of their previous classes so that the absent students will still be able to catch up with the class, and other students will also be able to revise what they have learned as many times as they want to.

For all of these reasons, I found out that Osaka University's Cybermedia Center can serve as a great learning alternative for students, both Japanese and foreign.

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
