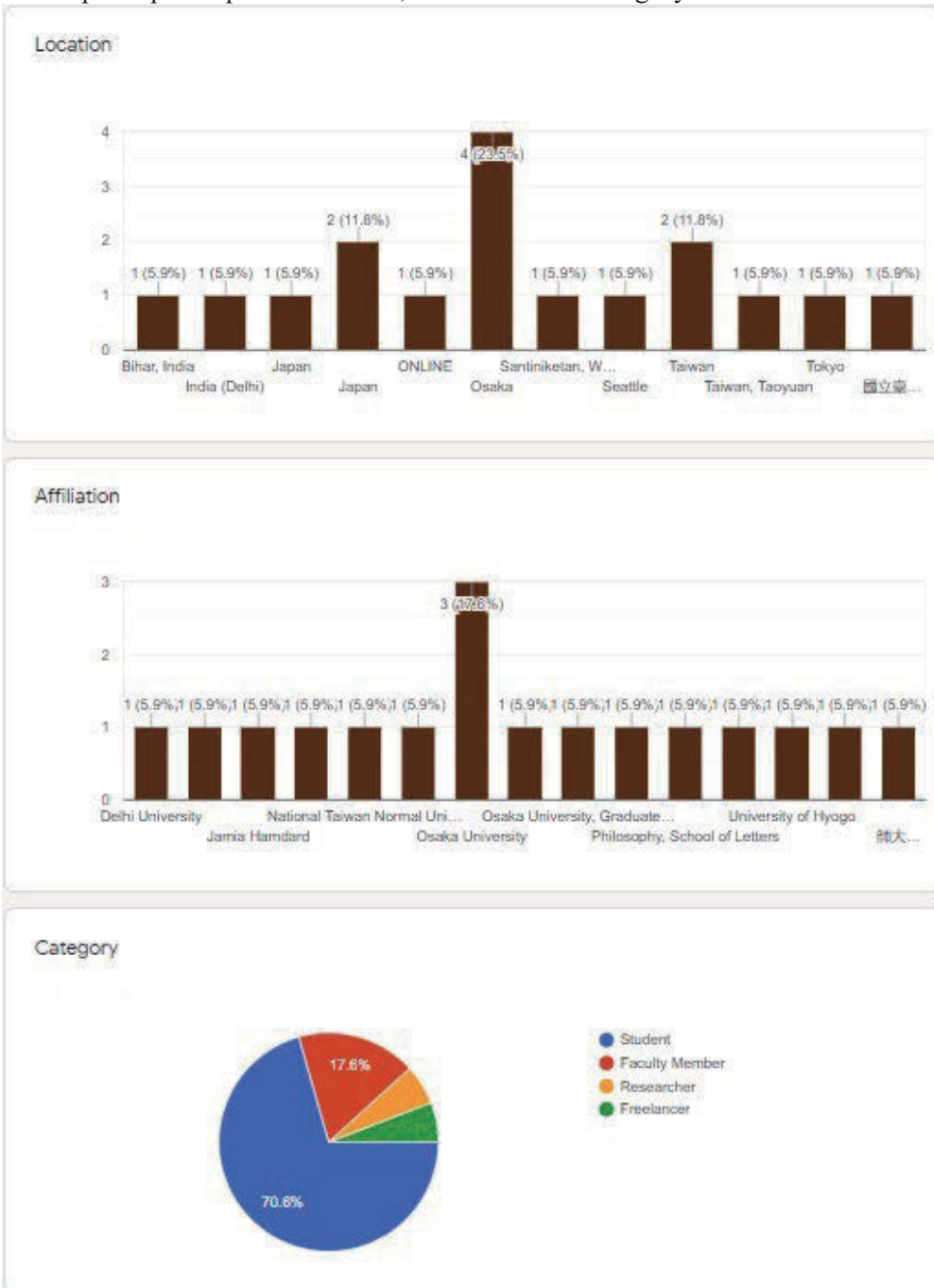

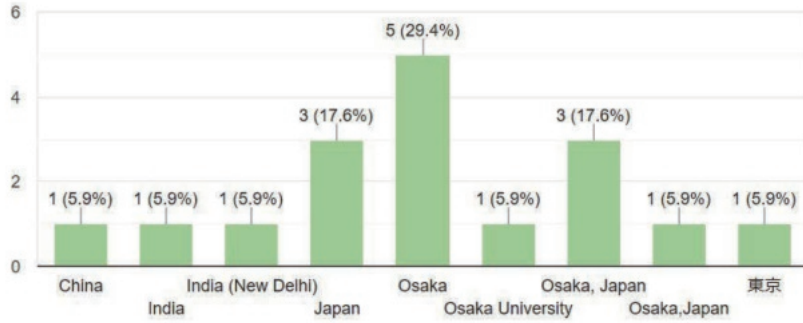

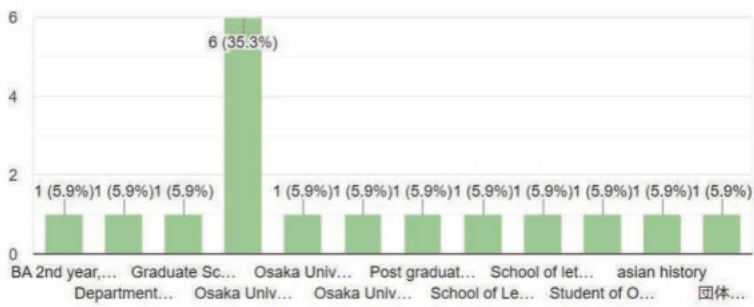

A Graph of participants' location, affiliation and category:

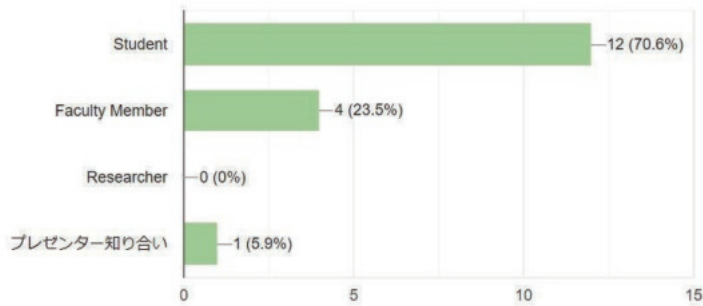
Location



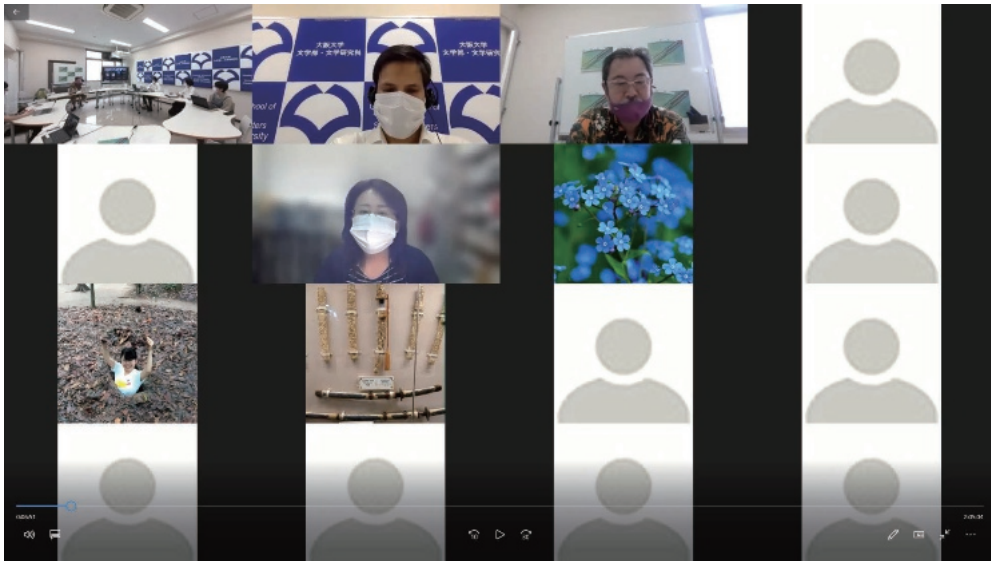
Affiliation



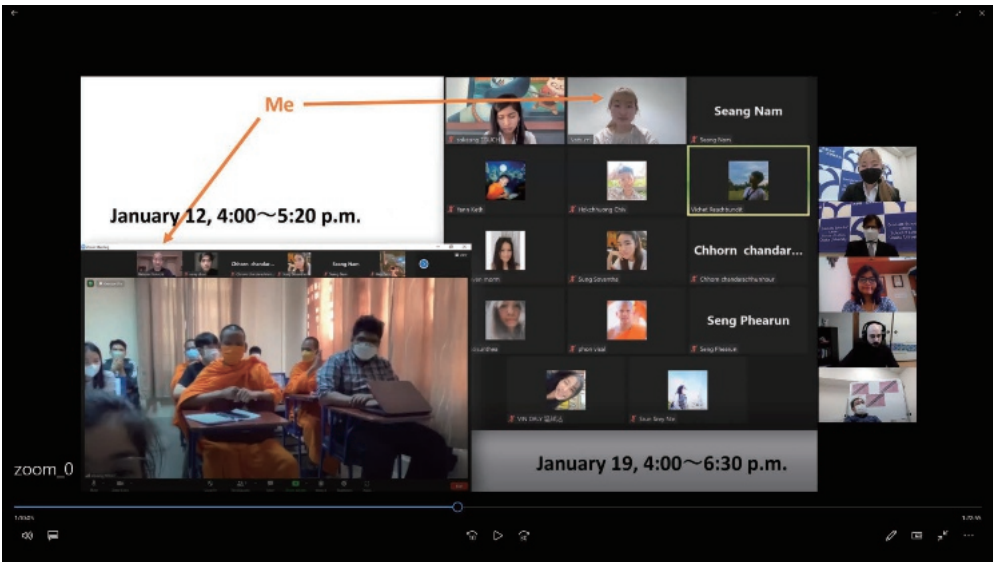
