What is society 5.0?

According to the Cabinet Office of Japanese Government:

- Society 5.0 is a "human-centered society that balances economic advancement with the resolution of social problems by a system that highly integrates cyberspace and physical space."
- They propose such a system, where the big data collected in physical space "is analyzed by artificial intelligence (AI), and the analysis results are fed back to humans in physical space in various forms."
- Society 5.0 "follows the hunting society (Society 1.0), agricultural society (Society 2.0), industrial society (Society 3.0), and information society (Society 4.0)."
